### What Does Resurrection Look Like?

The season of Lent is a time for self-examination, repentance, and recommitment to our spiritual practices. A season that takes us to Good Friday and the death of Jesus on a cross. And yet by this death we are prepared to celebrate resurrection on Easter. We cover a lot of emotional and spiritual ground during Lent. And we are the better for it.

I feel that we also have covered a lot of emotional and spiritual ground during our congregational discussions on January 15 and February 5 as we discussed both where we're at financially starting 2023, and where we're at in the typical life cycle of a church. If you are a church member who has not taken part in our annual Church Conference, or monthly Church Council meetings, you might not have seen our financial statements or annual budget. Many members of the congregation didn't realize that we have monthly Winter bills of over \$1,000.00 for natural gas heating. Or that we can easily spend another \$900.00 a month on plowing and salting. Or that the mortgage balance is almost \$41,000.00 since we re-mortgaged to help pay for the new roof on the church. Over the past five years we have hovered near balancing income and expenses, but usually haven't. We all have a role to play in achieving this balance, and we are thankful for the faithful stewardship of so many people. We are also grateful for the work that Cheryl Rykken does as our Church Treasurer to match up cash flow with bill payments each month. During these Winter months that is not easy to do.

We all know that our church building is both an asset and a very large overhead expense because it is simply very large! We spend a great deal of time and energy on fundraising with the food wagon each Summer to help pay for things like snow plowing and building maintenance. Imagine what it would be like to do fundraising for things like medical supplies for people in Turkey and Syria injured by earthquakes; or providing ongoing assistance to people who have been displaced by the war in Ukraine; or substantially supporting the work of the Community Cupboard and Mission of Hope House in New London.

We have work groups that are gathering information about: our community context for ministry; how our congregation is similar/different to other area churches; how our church leadership functions; what our fiscal and facility assets are; and how our current ministries align with emerging needs. As part of our ongoing work of information gathering and assessment, our District Superintendent Park Hunter will be joining us on Sunday, March 19 to preach during worship and to share lunch and discussion afterward. (That week we will only have one worship service so everyone can worship and interact with the D. S.)

I invite you to pray with me that through this Lenten season of congregational self-examination and recommitment God will lead to us to resurrection, and that we will not only see what that looks like – but that we will feel the Holy Spirit move through us to bring new life to all around us.

### Why Have an Anointing?

To receive an anointing with oil is one way to ask for God's blessing and healing. Following the worship services (when the camera is no longer recording) on Sunday, March 26 and Monday, March 27 anyone who wishes to receive an anointing with oil (on the forehead or the back of the hand) and prayer for healing (for either themselves or for someone else) can come to the kneelers at the front of the sanctuary. You can choose to kneel or stand. Pastor Joyce will ask you if the prayer is for yourself or for another person (you can say their name or not), and whether you wish to be anointed on the forehead or hand. A small amount of unscented oil will then be used for the anointing in the shape of a cross. Paster Joyce will then place her hands on your shoulders and offer a prayer for healing. You can then choose to stay where you and offer your own prayers to God, or to depart.

### **Holy Week Plans**

Holy Week starts with palms and Holy Communion in worship on Sunday, April 2 and Monday, April 3.

We will remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples on Holy Thursday, April 6. There will be an ecumenical Good Friday service here at NLUMC on April 7 from 12:15 to 1:00 PM. On Sunday, April 9 and Monday, April 10 we will celebrate the Easter blessing of Jesus' resurrection.
